	NAVIGATING TURBULENCE: ECONOMIC CHALLENGES AND DEMOCRATIC THREATS
9:30	In a world shaken by open warfare, rising trade tensions, and the resurgence of anti-democratic forces, cooperatives and mutuals must show resilience and boldness. This concise overview of the global economic and political context will shed light on the conditions in which our movement is evolving, as well as the collective responsibilities it bears.
	THE TIPPING POINTS
9:40	We are living in a time marked by tipping points —those critical thresholds where small changes can trigger rapid and irreversible transformations, whether in the climate, geopolitics, technology, or society. In the face of these major challenges, prevention and resilience must be our priorities. It is essential to adopt a proactive and collaborative approach to anticipate crises, mitigate their impacts, and build a sustainable future. Together, we have the responsibility to act before it is too late.
	1: EMPOWERING PEOPLE TO ACT
	This session will highlight the importance of "walking the talk" by empowering people to drive change. This will strengthen collective capital to build shared and lasting responsibility. It aims to equip individuals with tools to actively participate in the transition towards a more just future, while fostering innovation and cooperation within cooperatives.
10:00	Through ethical and transparent practices, the discussion will focus on how cooperatives can build trust, engage stakeholders, and strengthen their ability to face today's challenges: social inequalities, precarious employment, exclusion of vulnerable populations, social fragmentation, access to healthcare, and collective responses to health crises, including pandemics. These efforts directly support the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by placing cooperatives at the heart of global solutions.

COOPERATIVES IN THE DIGITAL AGE: CHALLENGES, OPPORTUNITIES, AND COLLECTIVE STRATEGIES

In this interactive innovation lab, participants will explore together the challenges and opportunities of digital transformation for cooperatives and mutuals to build and strengthen trust with members, and within the cooperative and non-cooperative communities. Supported by the collaborative online tool *MureWeb*, this space will enable a smooth exchange of ideas between the audience, invited experts, and the facilitator.

Starting from shared observations, the session will invite participants to co-create cooperative strategies to preserve their digital autonomy, strengthen their resilience, and pool their efforts. Key emerging ideas will be synthesized and shared at the end of the activity to support ongoing reflection across the network.

WORKSHOP 2.1: BUILDING IMPACTFUL INTERNATIONAL COOPERATIVE PARTNERSHIPS

This workshop will focus on creating strong international partnerships between cooperatives. Participants will explore best practices, tools, and strategies to promote collaboration across borders. The goal is to strengthen inter-cooperation to collectively tackle shared challenges, with an emphasis on strategic and sustainable partnerships that benefit all parties involved.

WORKSHOP 2.2: FINDING COLLABORATIVE SOLUTIONS TO GLOBAL CHALLENGES: CLIMATE, INEQUALITY, HEALTH AND RESOURCES

This workshop will focus on the collaborative resolution of pressing global challenges, such as climate change, social inequality, healthcare and resource scarcity. Cooperatives will discuss how they can work together to develop sustainable and impactful solutions to these global crises. The focus will be on practical examples and collaborative strategies that can have a direct impact on the environment and society, including innovative financial instruments (such as complementary currencies and public-private crowdfunding initiatives) and new organizational models for expanding financial services in rural and remote areas.

WORKSHOP 2.3: BUILDING A GLOBAL COOPERATIVE NETWORK—HARNESSING COLLECTIVE KNOWLEDGE IN THE AGE OF AI

This workshop will explore how cooperatives can build or strengthen global networks to share knowledge and resources, especially in the context of emerging technologies like artificial intelligence (AI). As AI transforms all sectors, cooperatives face new opportunities and risks. How can AI support their mission, improve collaboration, and build more resilient networks? What ethical and governance frameworks are needed to keep AI aligned with cooperative values? Participants will reflect together and share ideas on how to apply cooperative principles to AI—such as data cooperatives, fair data use, and support systems that promote ethical AI. The outcomes will contribute to the Summit's final report and help guide cooperative strategies in the digital age.

INNOVATION FACTORY 3—CO-CREATING INCLUSIVE AND LASTING CHANGE

This interactive co-creation exchange, involving participants, the facilitator, and the speaker, supported by a digital application, will explore the transition from extractive finance to restorative finance and the essential role of cooperatives in this shift. Together, participants will identify possible actions to adopt sustainable investment strategies, align financial activities with environmental and social goals, and support the ecological transition. The discussions will also cover financial instruments such as impact investing and green bonds. Emerging ideas will be collected and shared with the whole group to foster collective reflection and inspire concrete practices.

Through discussions and case studies, they will work on practical actions to reduce waste, improve energy efficiency, and promote green mobility.
